The HEAR Application Guide is designed to help you complete your HEAR Application Form.

WHAT IS THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACCESS ROUTE?

The Higher Education Access Route (HEAR) is a third level admissions scheme for students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. HEAR has been established by 8 Higher Education Institutions based on clear evidence¹ that socio-economic disadvantage negatively impacts on educational attainment at school and progression to higher education.

School leavers who present satisfactory evidence relating to their socio-economic circumstances and satisfy matriculation and subject requirements are eligible to compete for a quota of places allocated to applicants on a reduced points basis in each of the participating institutions as part of the Higher Education Access Route.

HEAR 2009 is a pilot year and is subject to review by the participating Higher Education Institutions.

WHY SHOULD I MAKE A HEAR APPLICATION?

Students who are eligible for the HEAR programme compete for a number of reduced points places in each of the participating HEIs.

Each HEI offers personal and academic support to students who enter the institutions through HEAR.

WHO SHOULD MAKE A HEAR APPLICATION?

HEAR is for school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. If you can answer yes to one or more of the following questions, you should make a HEAR Application:

1. Do you have a Medical Card/GP visit card?
2. Do your parents'/guardians' receive a means-tested social welfare payment?
3. Based on your parents'/guardians' income, do you expect to be eligible for the Higher Education Grant from your Local Authority or VEC?
4. Do you attend a secondary school that is part of the DEIS initiative run by the Department of Education and Science?
If you don't know ask your Guidance Counsellor or School Principal.
5. Are you a member of the traveller community?

HOW DO I MAKE A HEAR APPLICATION?

You will need to complete all parts of the Application Form and return it to your link institution by the deadline.

Your link institution is clearly stated on the first page of your Application Form.

Each HEI has the right to request further information relating to your HEAR application. Canvassing disqualifies.

If you have questions, check with your Guidance Counsellor, Visiting Teacher for Travellers, School Liaison Officer or School Principal.

HOW DO YOU GET MY CAO CHOICES AND WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

HEAR deals directly with the Central Applications Office (CAO) to get your CAO course choices.

If you take advantage of the change of mind option by 1 July 2009, the CAO will alert us and we will know what courses you have added or removed.

Some participating HEIs have restricted courses. This means these courses will only be considered for HEAR places if they were on your CAO form by 1 February 2009. You can find a full list of these courses at the back of this Application Guide.

Please note you may add these restricted courses to your CAO form after 1 February 2009, however they will not be considered for HEAR.

DO YOU LOOK AT ALL OF MY CAO COURSE CHOICES?

No, HEAR considers your first three course choices from your level 6/7 list and your first three course choices from your level 8 list. These are called your HEAR choices.

HEAR only considers course choices for the participating HEIs i.e. DCU, DIT, NUI Galway, NUI Maynooth, TCD, UCC, UCD and UL.

For example, if your CAO looks like this your HEAR choices are MH101, DN012 & GY101.

DO I NEED TO SIT THE HPAT IF I AM APPLYING FOR MEDICINE?

Yes, if you apply to a Medicine course you are required to sit the Health Professional Aptitude Test (HPAT). The only sitting of this test is 14 February 2009. For further information please see www.hpat-ireland.acer.edu.au.

I AM ELIGIBLE FOR HEAR WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

The participating HEIs have a limited number of reduced points places available to HEAR applicants. If you are eligible, you will compete for one of these places.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I GOT A HEAR PLACE?

If you are successful you will receive a CAO offer and a letter from the relevant HEI. This letter is your HEAR offer.

If you accept your HEAR offer you are required to attend an orientation programme. This orientation is compulsory. If you fail to complete the orientation your HEAR offer and/or post entry supports may be withdrawn.

WHAT IF MY APPLICATION IS INELIGIBLE?

HEAR applications are reviewed very carefully. If you are ineligible for HEAR you have the right to appeal.

Please note canvassing will disqualify.

WHAT IF MY APPLICATION IS INCOMPLETE?

This means you did not submit the required documents by the deadlines. If your application is incomplete you cannot appeal.

I HAVE TO PAY FEES CAN HEAR HELP?

No, HEAR will not pay any tuition or registration fees.

- Grade C3 in TWO Higher Level subjects and Grade D3 in FOUR Ordinary or Higher Level subjects including Mathematics and English or Irish.
- Obtain the specific programme requirements.

DCU will consider you on the basis of SIX subjects in ONE sitting of the Leaving Certificate. We cannot guarantee entry based on the Minimum Entry Requirements. DCU does not offer HEAR places in the following courses: DC211, DC212, DC213.

If you apply to Trinity College you must meet matriculation and course requirements.

As a HEAR applicant you are considered competitive if, after meeting matriculation and course requirements, you reach approximately 80 - 90% of the Leaving Certificate points for the courses of your choice.

Please note, that through HEAR, applicants can apply for reserve places in Coláiste Mhuire, Marino (CM001/002 only), Froebel College, Blackrock (FR001/002 only) and Church of Ireland, College of Education, Rathmines (CE001 only).

If you apply to University College Cork you must meet the Minimum Entry Requirements. These are:

- Minimum of 6 subjects in your Leaving Certificate with a minimum of HC3 in two subjects and OD3 in four other subjects recognised for entry purposes to include English, Irish and another language.
- There are also specific subject and grade requirements for particular degree programmes.
- Nursing programmes & BSc in Biomedical Sciences do not require a language other than English and Irish.

If you apply to UCD you must achieve the Minimum Entry Requirements. These are:

- Grade C3 in two higher level subjects and Grade D3 in four ordinary or higher level subjects including English and Irish
- Obtain the specific programme requirements

You may be required to attend an interview for Architecture (DN001); Medicine (DN002); Radiography (DN004); Veterinary Medicine (DN005).

All parts of your application must be completed accurately and submitted to your link institution by the stated deadlines. If you don't send in all information by the deadlines, your application will not be considered for HEAR places.

This guide explains how to fill in each part of the HEAR application form.

PART I ABOUT YOU

This part of the application form asks for your personal details.

WHAT IS A PPS NUMBER?

Every person in Ireland has a PPS number. This is a unique number made up of 7 digits and 1 letter. If you can't find your PPS number you should contact your Local Social Welfare Office. To find the address or contact number of your local office consult the Department of Social & Family Affairs website www.welfare.ie.

WHAT IS A CAO NUMBER?

When you apply to the Central Applications Office (CAO) you will receive an 8 digit CAO number that begins with 09.

WHAT IF I HAVEN'T RECEIVED MY CAO NUMBER BY 1 FEBRUARY?

Please complete your HEAR application and forward your CAO number to your link institution as soon as possible.

HOW DO I FILL IN THE ADDRESS SECTION?

This is one of the most important sections on the form.

PART 2 ABOUT YOUR SCHOOL

WHY DO YOU ASK ABOUT MY SECONDARY SCHOOL?

We need to know your secondary school because only applicants attending a secondary school linked to a participating HEI are eligible to apply for HEAR.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY SCHOOL IS LINKED?

If you have questions, check with your Guidance Counsellor, Visiting Teacher for Travellers, School Liaison Officer or Principal.

PART 3 ABOUT YOUR FAMILY

WHICH PEOPLE IN MY FAMILY DO I NEED TO TELL YOU ABOUT?

Make sure to list all immediate family members who live at home including your parents or guardians.

If your brother or sister is studying and living away from home make sure to include them.

WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY FURTHER/HIGHER EDUCATION?

You should say yes to this question if your sibling or parent/guardian is:

- Currently studying a college/university course
- Has finished secondary school and is going on for further education

You should say no to this question if your sibling is:

- In primary or secondary school
- Doing an apprenticeship.

PART 4 ABOUT YOUR MEDICAL/GP VISIT CARD

Use this part of your application to tell us about your Medical/GP Visit Card. If you do not have a Medical/GP Visit Card, you do not need to complete Form 1.

I HAVE A MEDICAL/GP VISIT CARD WHAT WILL I NEED TO DO?

If you or your parent/guardian has a Medical/GP Visit card you must fill in Part 1 of the form. You will find the information to complete Part 1 printed on your Medical/GP Visit card.

Once you have this completed, bring or post Form 1 to the HSE Health Office that issued your card and ask them to stamp and sign Form 1.

Form 1 must be returned to your link institution by 3 April 2009 by 5:00pm. Late or incomplete forms will not be accepted.

WHERE IS MY HSE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICE?

You can find details of all HSE Local Health Offices on the website www.hse.ie or contact the HSE info line from 8am to 8pm, Monday to Saturday at callsave 1850 24 1850 or info@hse.ie. If you are still unsure, the best place to ask is your family doctor's office.

PART 5 ABOUT YOUR PARENTS'/GUARDIANS' SOCIAL WELFARE PAYMENT

WHAT DO I DO IF MY PARENTS/GUARDIANS GET A SOCIAL WELFARE PAYMENT?

You will need to submit Form 2. Once you complete Part 1, your parents/guardians will need to bring or post Form 2 to their Local Social Welfare Office and a representative from the Department of Social and Family Affairs must complete the rest of Form 2.

WHAT IF MY MEDICAL/GP VISIT CARD HAS EXPIRED?

Your Medical/GP Visit Card must be valid as of 3 April 2009. Cards that expire before 3 April 2009 are not valid and will not be considered.

WHAT IF MY MEDICAL/GP VISIT CARD IS PENDING?

You must have a Medical/GP Visit Card by 3 April 2009. HEAR does not consider applicants with pending cards.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE A MEDICAL/GP VISIT CARD?

If you don't have a Medical/GP Visit card just tick no. You do not need to complete Form 1.

Form 2 must be returned to your link institution by 3 April 2009 by 5:00pm. Late or incomplete forms will not be accepted.

WHERE IS MY LOCAL SOCIAL WELFARE OFFICE?

PART 6 ABOUT YOUR PARENTS'/GUARDIANS' FINANCES

WHAT FINANCIAL DOCUMENTS DO I NEED FOR MY APPLICATION?

Please see the table below to find out what financial documents are required.

All documents need to be submitted to your link institution by 3 April 2009 by 5:00pm. Late or incomplete documents will not be accepted.

HOW DO I GET A P21 OR NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT?

Your parents/guardians will not automatically receive a P21 or Notice of Assessment from Revenue.

They will need to apply for this online or by contacting their local Revenue Office. Please check www.revenue.ie to find your local Revenue Office.

MY PARENTS/GUARDIANS WORK OUTSIDE IRELAND. WHAT FINANCIAL DOCUMENTS DO I NEED?

Please contact your link institution as documents required vary depending on where your parents/guardians are working.

MY FAMILY HAS A TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE AND/OR A TAX CREDIT DOCUMENT; CAN I SUBMIT THIS INSTEAD OF A P21 OR NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT?

No, you must submit a P21 or a Notice of Assessment. Tax clearance certificates or tax credit documents are not accepted.

MY PARENTS ARE NOT LEGALLY SEPARATED WHAT DOCUMENTS DO I PROVIDE?

If your parents are not legally separated and you do not have a separation agreement, you will need to provide an affidavit from a solicitor or commissioner of oaths stating the date of separation and the amount of maintenance your family receives each month.

It is important to note that documents can take several weeks to be issued. Late documents will not be accepted.

PART 7 ABOUT YOUR PARENTS'/GUARDIANS' JOBS

Use this part of the application to tell us about your parents'/guardians' employment history. You will need their help to fill this part in accurately.

WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY EMPLOYMENT STATUS?

Employment status is what your parents/guardians are doing for work right now. Fill this part in for both parents.

WHAT IF ONE OF MY PARENTS/GUARDIANS DOESN'T LIVE WITH ME?

If you are in contact with that parent/guardian you need to complete this part even if they don't live with you.

WHAT IF I CAN'T ANSWER BECAUSE I HAVE NO CONTACT WITH MY PARENTS/GUARDIANS?

If you can't answer because you have no contact with your parents/guardians, please tick the box marked No Contact.
