### Research Group Description

The Security Group has expertise in security and privacy in IoT and pervasive computing settings, privacy enhancing technologies and anonymity, and cryptography. The School of Computer Science & IT hosts several research groups and centres, more than 30 research fellows and postdocs, and more than 40 PhDs.

### Project idea and researcher opportunities

*Research Field: Information Science and Engineering - ENG*

Current research directions in the Security Group include location privacy, Tor and anonymous routing networks, as well as privacy in smart cities and healthcare. We are especially interested to talk to potential candidates with projects in these domains, although all areas in cyber security will be considered. The successful candidate will have significant opportunities for collaborative and multi-disciplinary research, secondment, and training. The Security Group has established research links with a number of universities across Europe, as well as the thriving cyber security industry in Cork and Ireland.

### Researcher Requirements

- The researcher must fulfil the MSCA-IF mobility and experienced researcher requirements.<sup>1</sup>
- The researcher should have a strong background in cyber security. Experience in cryptography and/or privacy enhancing technologies is an asset.

<sup>1</sup> **MSCA-IF mobility:** The researcher must not have resided or carried out the main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the beneficiary for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately before the call September 12<sup>th</sup> deadline (flexible 36 months in the 5 previous years if eligible for career restart or reintegration fellowship <https://www.iaa.ie/irish-marie-curie-office/funding-calls/individual-fellowships/> )

**Experienced researcher requirements:** The researcher must have at least 4-years full time research experience or hold a doctorate before the September 12<sup>th</sup> deadline.
