All 7 Irish Universities are ranked in the **top 3% of worldwide universities**.

Dublin City University

- NUI Galway is Ireland's top university for graduate employability, student retention and commercialisation of research



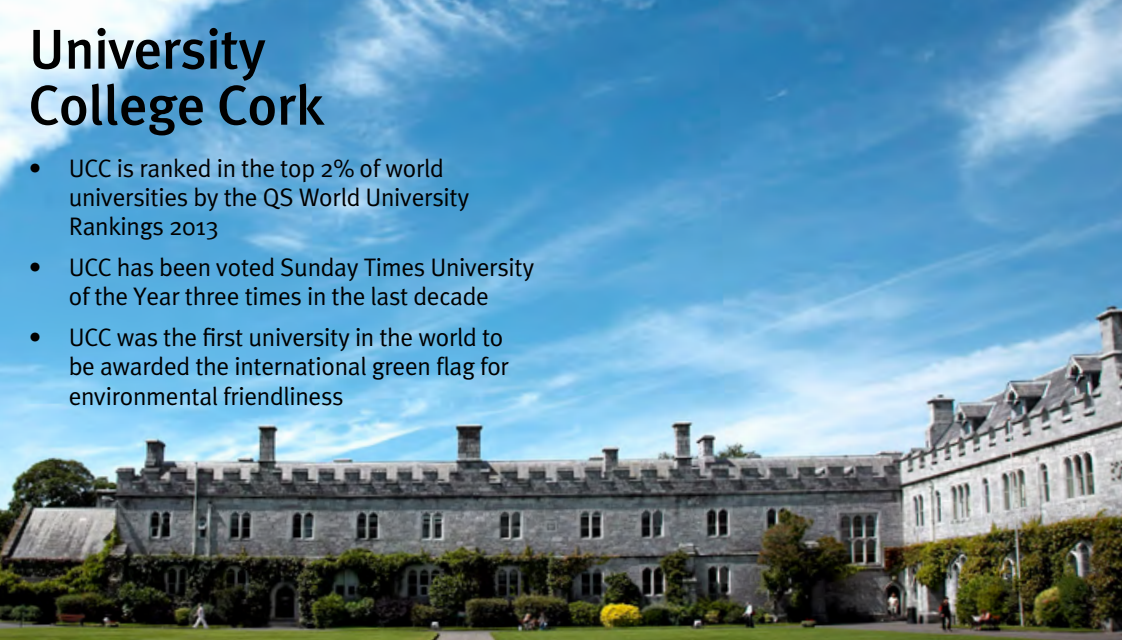
National University of Ireland Maynooth

- The University runs one of the largest cooperative education (internship) programmes in the European Union



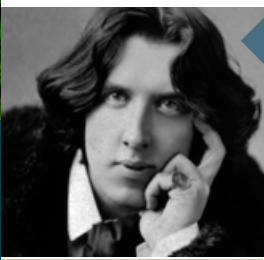
What it means to be an Irish University Graduate

Irish University Graduates emerge as **leaders, thinkers, innovators** and **problem solvers**.

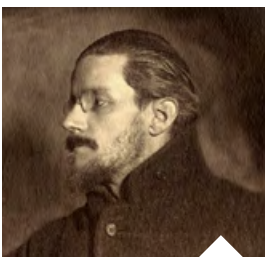
Irish University Graduates are **great communicators** and **team players**.

Irish Nobel Prize winning novelist, playwright, theatre director, and poet.



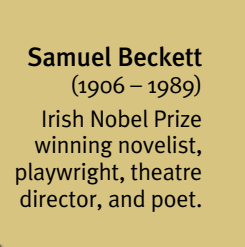

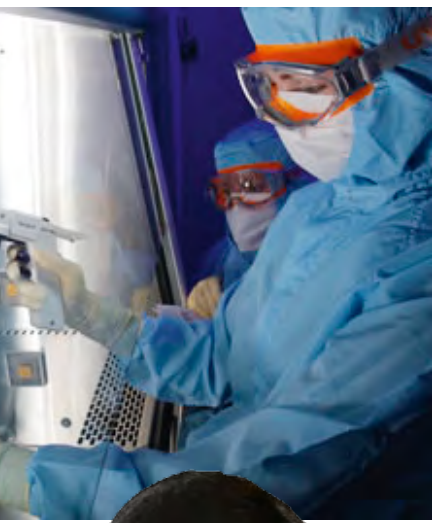

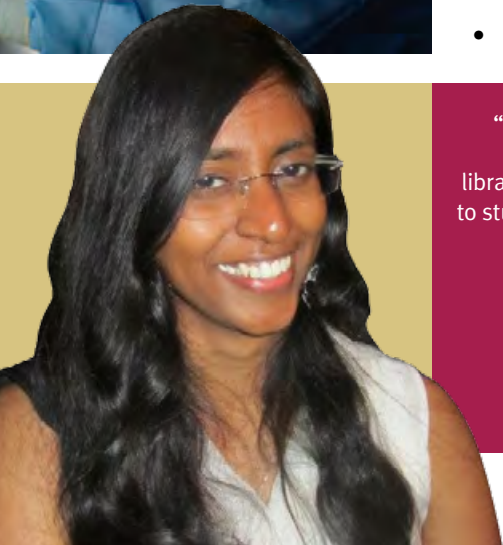

How to Apply

Students from outside the European Union (EU) apply directly to their chosen university. Applicants should contact the Admissions Office or International Office of the relevant university for information on the application process, as each university has its own application procedures and closing dates.

Entry Requirements

Entry Requirements will vary between different universities and degree programmes. The international offices of the seven universities will let students know what grades are needed for each course.

Costs

Tuition costs for non-EU students compare favourably with other countries, ranging from €8,000 - €22,000 per year. Medical and Veterinary Programmes can be up to €40,000 per year.

Living costs:

A student can expect to spend between €7,000- €10,000 per year, depending on accommodation and lifestyle.

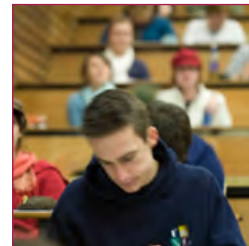
Visas

Full details on visa application procedures and a link to the online visa application form can be found on the website of the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS) - www.inis.gov.ie.

For EU citizens, there are no visa requirements when entering Ireland.

Some but not all non-EU/EEA students require an entry visa for Ireland. A list of countries that are not visa required can be found on the INIS website. If a country is not on the list then a visa is required.
